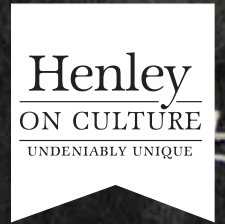
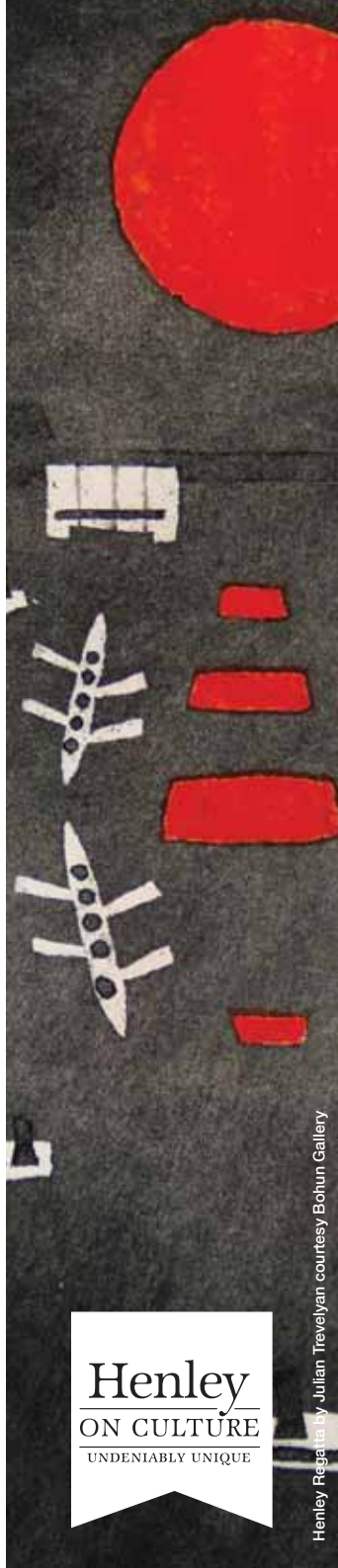

HENLEY ON THAMES

In addition to being one of the most attractive riverside towns in England, Henley enjoys a strong reputation for supporting the arts, with more galleries per head of population than any other town in the South East.

This walking trail guides you around the town's principal commercial & public galleries and antiquarian booksellers while taking you past all the major sights in the town.

A. Starting at the *Old Fire Station Gallery* behind Henley's impressive Town Hall, proceed through the Market Square on to Hart Street where a number of galleries can be found on the south side.

1 THE OLD FIRE STATION GALLERY

Upper Market Place.

A rolling programme of art, sculpture, photography, textiles and craft in conjunction with the Henley Art and Craft Guild.

2 JONKERS RARE BOOKS

24 Hart Street. Antiquarian bookseller specialising in 20th Century first editions, children's and illustrated books plus nineteenth century literature, literary sets and fine bindings as well as Thames topography.

3 WHITTINGTON FINE ART

26 & 28 Hart Street.

The two adjacent galleries specialise in painting by contemporary British artists plus sculptures and bronzes from some of the country's leading sculptors.

4 JACK'S GALLERY

36 Hart Street. Prints and limited editions by renowned Scottish artist Jack Vettriano, also Rolf Harris and a selection of oil paintings.

B. Moving down to the river, look out for the keystones of Tamesis and Isis by Anne Damer on the historical bridge, completed in 1786. Head past the *Angel on the Bridge* on Thameside; along your way you will find:

5 BARRY KEENE GALLERY

12 Thameside. Paintings, watercolours, drawings, etchings and prints from the 18th Century, Victorian, Edwardian & 20th Century, with recent paintings and sculptures by some of Britain's leading artists

C. Follow the towpath on the river for a quarter of a mile to the award winning *River & Rowing Museum*, built in 1998 by Sir David Chipperfield to resemble a traditional Thames boathouse.

6 RICHARD WAY BOOKS

54 Friday Street. A wonderful selection of antique river prints with a comprehensive collection of books on the Thames, rowing and many other titles.

7 RIVER & ROWING MUSEUM

Mill Meadows.

Dedicated to Rowing, Rivers and the history of Henley on Thames, also the magical Wind in the Willows exhibition. Constantly evolving art and photography exhibitions, nature trails, craft workshops and family days. Look out for the huge John Piper mural between the River & Henley galleries.

D. Follow Meadow Road back to Station Road and right into Reading Road, then Duke Street before crossing the Market Square into Bell Street for the *Bell Bookshop*. Turn right into New Street to see one of Britain's oldest theatres, *The Kenton*.

9 HENLEY STUDIO

22 Duke Street Photo studio and picture framer with frequent art exhibitions.

8 BOHUN GALLERY

15 Reading Road Contemporary British fine art: paintings, sculpture, watercolours, drawings, original prints, ceramics. Artists represented include John Piper, Elisabeth Frink, Donald Hamilton Fraser, Mary Fedden, and Eric Rimmington. The Gallery also represents the estate of Julian Trevelyan.

10 LEMONGROVE GALLERY

10 Duke Street. Part of a small chain of commercial galleries showing contemporary works, limited editions and sculptures by artists including Doug Hide, Rolf Harris, Ben Payne and George Somerville.

1 Duke Street Modern British Art, incl. Post War period and St Ives Artists. An eclectic mix of drawings, paintings, sculptors and watercolours from the 20th Century with regular exhibitions.

44 New Street Shop and gallery showing Simon Drew's witty and original cards, prints and posters.
