St Mary's Parish Church

St Mary's Parish Church - dating from the 12th century, St Mary's church has been a feature of Henley's town and skyline for nearly a thousand years. Today the Church serves part of the Town (which it 'shares' with Trinity Parish) and is the venue for many concerts and similar functions, as well as serving as the 'Town Church', especially with the Annual Civic Service and the Royal Regatta Service. It has a fine choral tradition, and services are held every day, with a Sung Eucharist on Sunday mornings at 9.30am - there are always vacancies in the choir, as well as in Junior Church which is held during the main service.

The Church forms a United Benefice with St Nicholas' Remenham, on the other side of the river, near the iconic Temple Island. Also dating from around the same period and originally served by the monks of nearby Hurley Abbey, St Nicholas' is much appreciated for its (usually) quiet country setting. There is a service at St Nicholas' every Sunday at 11.15am (Sung Matins or Holy Communion on alternate Sundays)
