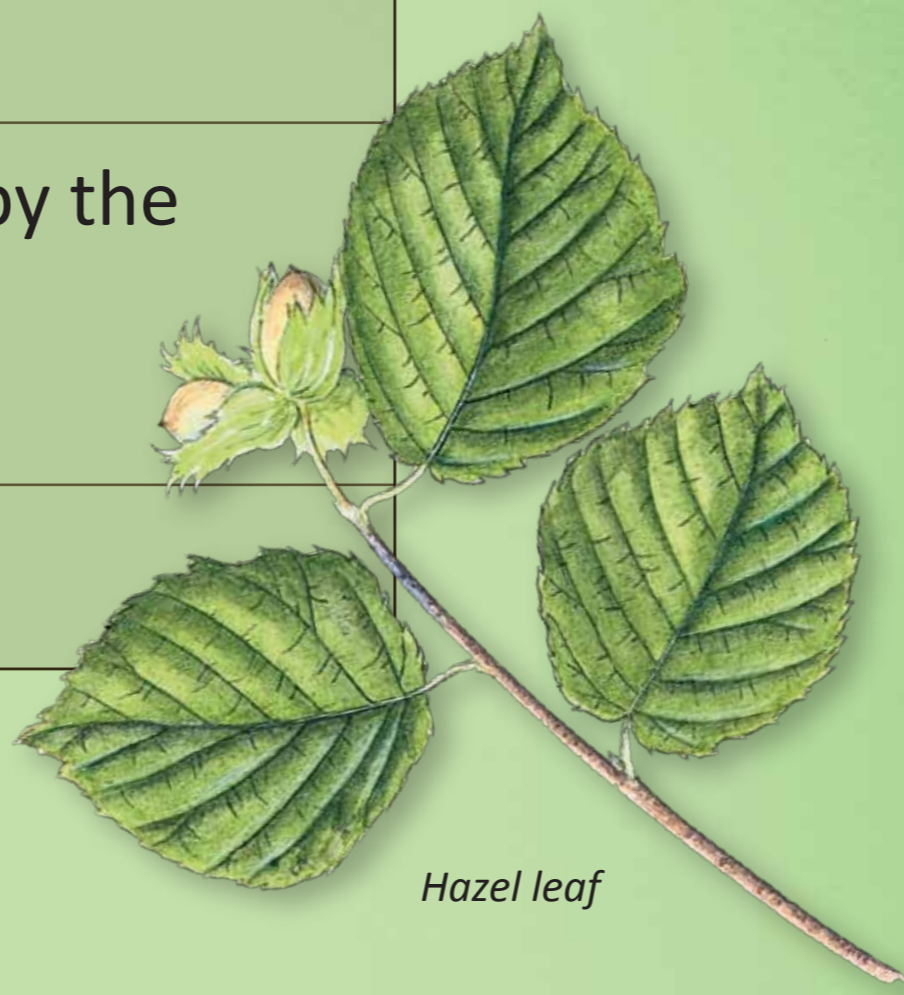
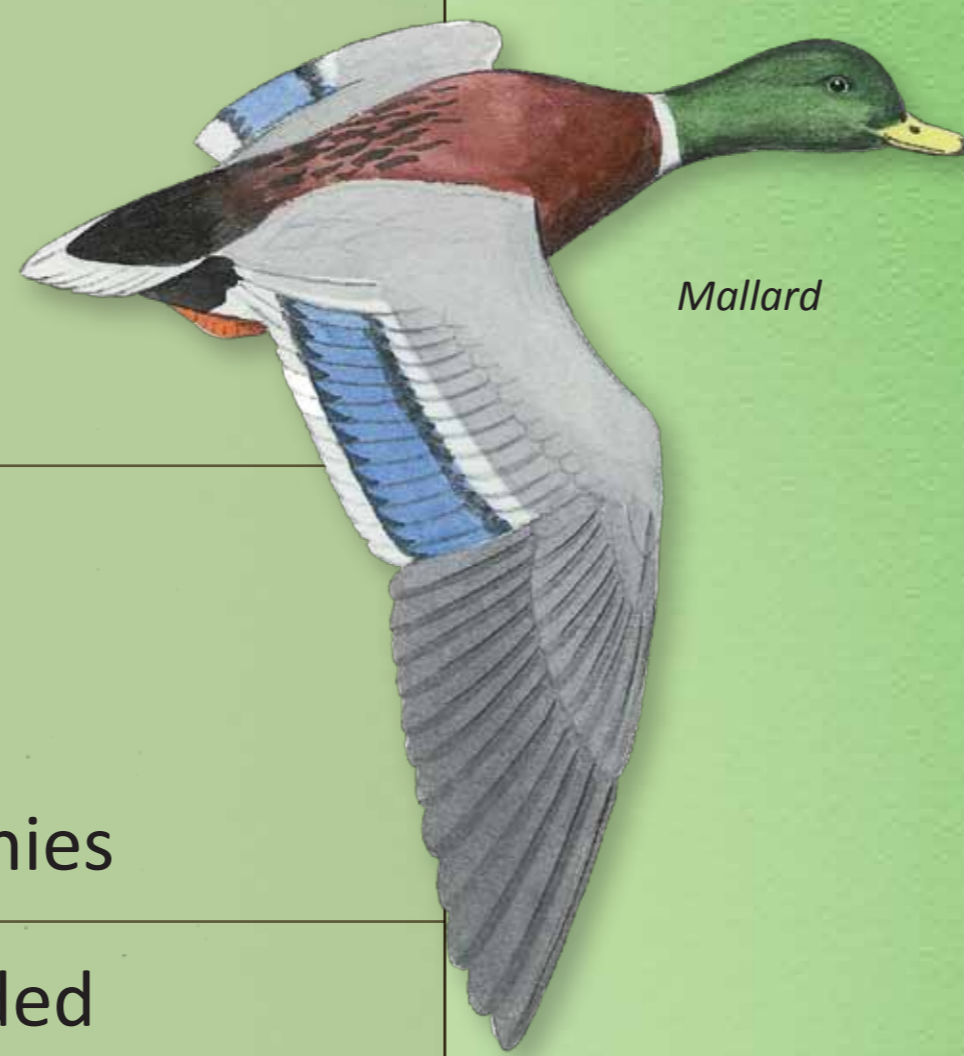


MILL MEADOWS & MARSH MEADOWS

1921	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mill Meadows purchased by Henley Council for the price of £2,800
1922	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The land raised by 2-3 feet overall and 3018 cubic yards of ballast used • Lake excavated with entry and exit from Cold Bath Stream • Two bridges crossed the lake • Tennis courts provided • The cost of all of this work was £7,000
1923	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two trophy German field guns placed beside the meadows • Tennis court fees 2/6d per hour (25 pence) • Boat letting sites provided by various companies
1924	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grass tennis courts and Bowling green provided
1931	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trophy German guns removed as they were considered an "eyesore" • Refreshment kiosk provided
1933	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lake causing problems at this time with mosquitoes • Ducks introduced to the lake to keep the algae and weeds down
1939	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lake filled in
1966	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Marsh Meadows bought by the Town
1990	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Leichlingen Pavilion built (named after twin town in Germany) • Bowls Club moved into part of it
1995	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Henley Wildlife Group began managing areas
1998	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • River & Rowing Museum built on land leased by the town for one red rose a year and opened by HM Queen Elizabeth
2005	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rotary Garden created
